YOUR BIRTHDAY NUMEROLOGY

I first discovered Cheiro (Count Louis Hamon) at school. His classic, Cheiro's Book of Numbers, was published in 1926 and is still published today.

Add Up Your Birthdate

To add up your birthdate and find your personality and destiny according to Cheiro's method, write down all the numbers in a straight line and add across. Then keep adding until you get a number that counts – 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 or 9.

Here are some examples.

Charles, Prince of Wales 14th of November 1948 (or 14-11-1948)

Reduce this again to a single digit between 1 and 9.

$$2 + 9 = 11$$

And reduce it again

$$1 + 1 = 2$$

Charles, Prince of Wales, is a number two in numerology.

So was Cheiro right? Remember his book appeared in the shops over 20 years before Charles was born.

The Number Two

Gentle by nature, imaginative, artistic and romantic.

Well, in the year 2020 that sounds just about right. As you read this, Prince Charles (the artistic Royal) has issued a public call to save arts organisations in Great Britain. The limited edition book of his paintings, Watercolours, is currently listed at \$2200 at online booksellers.

Is it romantic to marry the woman you broke up your first marriage for? Well, his fans would agree.

Here is another example of adding up a birthdate. Her Majesty the Queen was born on 21st April 1926 (or 21-4-1926). We put the numbers in a straight line, add them together, until we can reduce the number to 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 or 9.

The Queen is a 7 person and this is what Cheiro had to say about this number:

"They become keenly interested in the affairs of far-off lands. They devour books on travel and have a wide universal knowledge of the world at large."

Her Majesty is of course the Head of the Commonwealth. Cheiro wrote these words when she was a very small girl.

New Numerology for the 21st Century

I will leave you to uncover the wonders of Cheiro's classic work yourself. I also really like Tania Gabrielle's book, The Ultimate Guide to Numerology (Fair Winds, 2018) which takes you far deeper into the mysteries of numerology.

The fact is, we can take the old 20th century ideas about birth numbers and bring them up to date, so that you have an accurate picture of who you are.

Updating Cheiro's Book

Cheiro originally used just the birthdate (not the entire birthday) to read numbers, but in this age of computers (and even birth times measured to the second) we can do more with his central ideas about numerology and show you your whole birthday, including your year and month, according to the numbers.

ONE

You are the 'smallest positive' and in fact, one is the smallest positive number. By yourself, not taking up more room than you should, you have great energy. You're ace, literally. You also keep it simple. You can do a lot with a very little. You are the sole unit that others plug into bigger ventures, like clubs, teams, societies, charities, associations, unions, parties, organisations. Did you know that in many gadgets the numeral 1 represents 'on' which means electricity is flowing? You make things flow, too. We associate you with the dwarf planet Ceres in astrology, the first of her kind to be discovered. Ceres is a symbol of fierce independence in astrology. She goes it alone. She is also a symbol of coming first – for at least half the time.

You will find that you have to compromise on being number one in your life, but you will be the winner long enough to satisfy you. Like a Formula One champion you can wear the 1 (First) world champ title for the year that you own it. Then someone else takes it. Ceres is number one for six months a year, when she rules spring and summer, and then steps back when Pluto takes over for winter and autumn. You need to share being first.

Is one the loneliest number? A song by Harry Nilsson thought so but that's not the case at all. You do your own thing, in your own way, and find the right people to support you – friends, partners, family. You pitch to people. You throw to them. (Just like the number 1 on a pitcher's shirt, you are always counted in the scores). In football the number 1 belongs to the goalkeeper. This idea of the individual plugging into the wider group is key. A fullback or loosehead prop is also in a 1 shirt.

You have to learn that 'My way or the highway' is not the way, and you do this as a small child. There are many 1 Highways and 1 bus routes, but if you are going to stay in the traffic and make the journey, you have to learn to give way, which you do.

One is the number known as the 'Root of Unity' and you play a concentrated, single, focussed part in all really successful united efforts and united systems. TWO

Your preference is for 'even Stevens' relationships and partnerships of all kinds, and of course two is the first of the even numbers. Getting even, particularly if there are issues in a marriage or professional duet, can be a pattern so be aware of it. Of course, you may also find that others (in a two-way connection) also need to get even with you. Once you are conscious of this pattern you can take steps to leave it behind.

The 'power of two' is a well-known phrase and so is the idea of anything being squared. Once you understand what your power is, finding the right person in love or work to join you is a real turning point. This is the number of the power couple or dynamic duo.

Scales have two bowls, either side and this is a good image to associate with your number. We link your number to Libra, the sign of the scales, which is known as 'Balance' in France. The idea of balancing yourself with another is central to your sense of identity but also your achievements in life.

There is a real problem for you with 'looking out for number one' or 'being number one' as it unbalances those scales. Dealing with self-interest, selfishness or a competitive streak in another can be very hard work for you. The idea of 'coming first and being second' is also something you have to really work at figuring out, as you don't really operate that way. It's all very well for action men like Bruce Lee to have obsessed about being 'number one' but actually, you do better when you are in a duet where 'different but equal' is the theme.

This idea of complementing someone else is central to who you are. There is no question of someone being 'second' in this way of thinking about everything. You could put down the various assets, qualities or advantages of either yourself or another – on paper – and you would still see through it to the essential truth, which is that both are better off together than apart.

There is no main story with a side story, just the successful story of two different people (and sometimes organisations) which benefit from each other and help each other co-exist as a powerful central force.

THREE

This is the first odd prime number, and you are the odd one out in situations (or with people) which you do not need – and which do not need you. This is a curious pattern with your sign and it can happen from childhood. You are not especially 'odd' but you are certainly unique and you need exactly the right circumstances to feel comfortable and to express your personality. The saying 'Two is company, three is a crowd' could have applied to you and both parents, or you and a parent and sibling, or you and two schoolfriends!

You learn to juggle people and situations as a result and are very sensitive to chemistry. You know exactly who and what works for you later on in life and don't mind doing your own thing – as an independent individual – to take care of yourself. People can urge you to join in as much as they like, but if you feel like the odd one out, you'll find other ways to connect with your fellow humans.

A triangle has three sides and is the most stable shape. The pyramids have lasted centuries, built around this polygon with three edges. You have staying power, too. You learn from experience and find out what works for you, and stick to it. You are multi-faceted and multi-sided.

You may have heard of the Three Jewels of Buddhism or the Christian Holy Trinity. The Hindu Trimurti or the Three Pure Ones of Tao. And of course, in astrology, we know there were three wise men. The Shield of the Trinity is a sacred understanding, and again, we have to think about the pyramid of Ancient Egypt, as a sacred place. In the Jewish tradition of Kabbalah, the soul has three parts.

The Buddhists take refuge in the three jewels, and you find refuge within as well. Understanding your own soul and spirit as well as you do (sometimes because you are left to your own devices, as you do not fit in with particular couples or pairs) you have strong self-knowledge.

It takes time to get there (third time's a charm) but once you are on your way in life, you achieve your own hat-tricks. It may be an issue for you to deal with work, family or shared households – friendships or groups – where you are the third of The Three Musketeers, or the third of Three Amigos. Yet, left to yourself, as you pursue who or what actually feels right to you, your reward is deep comprehension of your own soul.

FOUR

There is something reassuring, stable and comforting about you. We think about balance, symmetry and harmony with the number four. When people talk about 'four walls' they are describing who and what feels like home. In astrology, the Fourth House of the horoscope is ruled by Cancer the crab (who carries her home on her back) and is also linked with the idea of security, reassurance, protection and grounding.

One of the first things you learn at school is that $2x^2 = 4$ and this is the classic family unit. Two parents, man and wife, and a girl and a boy! Of course in modern life that is something which belongs to the distant days of old 20^{th} century advertising, but this idea of structure is pretty close to who you are, and what you do.

You are also 'structured' as opposed to some of the other numbers floating around your world! You have built yourself, and rebuilt yourself, a particular way. In fact, if you look at the digit 4 on a pocket calculator or digital watch, it looks like part of a building or architectural plan. An apartment just waiting for the next floor or roof.

I am sure you know that 'four' can be written with a closed or open top. This reflects the two different stages of your development in life (and you may repeat this all your life, too). Open to development, change and progress – and finished, complete and unchanging. Buying your own apartment or house can really bring this out, if you are lucky enough to be a purchaser.

The four elements – earth, water, fire and wind – complete the universe. There is a great search for completion here, and in Hindusim, there are four stages one goes through to complete a life. Student, householder, retiree and finally – renunciation. The four corners of the world on the compass also give us this sense of wholeness. A place for everything, and everything in its place. Four has always represented what is solid, since prehistory. Most furniture has four legs. You can lean on it, rely on it, and

it lasts! That's you, too, and you have a 'steady beat' which is perhaps why the most common time signature in so many of our favourite, most long-lived songs, is founded on four beats. You are built to last and like what lasts.

FIVE

Chanel made your number famous with her exquisite, expensive scent. We have five fingers on each hand and 'Give me five' and 'High five' is a mark of success. Chanel No. 5 is historically the most successful fragrance on the planet.

Five is an untouchable odd number and nobody can touch you, when it comes to lasting achievements. Starfish have a characteristic five-star shape and there is something glittering about you, once you discover what gives you star quality.

You can be fierce in withstanding competition, opposition or the other tests of life. Hurricanes and tornadoes at their most powerful are Category 5 and you can be quite formidable.

You are ambitious, potent and pretty persuasive. Some of the most gold-plated groups and bands in modern music use 'five' in their names. So, from Five, to MC5, to The Dave Clark Five, to The Jackson 5, to Grandmaster Flash and the Curious Five and Ben Folds Five - you have inspiration.

You tune in to what is popular very easily and this is part of the reason you are so fortunate with your projects and plans. A perfect fifth in music is the basis for most tuning systems in western music, and you have the gift of sensing what people want. Once you develop a product or service, it lasts. The Olympic Games, no matter what, continues as the world's most popular sporting event in history and one of television's most popular occasions. The five interlocked rings have worked their magic. We 'tune in' to the Olympics as it tunes into us, no matter which of the five continents we live on – Asia, Africa, Australia, Oceania or the Americas.

In radio communication, 'five by five' indicates a perfect signal which is clear, cuts through the noise, and strong. This brings us back to Chanel's famous perfume, No. 5 along with The Jackson Five (where Michael Jackson began his career). You also have this kind of pure, powerful signal and it is easy for people to tune in, just as you tune into them – and all that they desire and need.

SIX

Snowflakes and beehives both have six sides (hexagons). There are also said to be six degrees of separation between you and any other person on earth. Six is also slang for MI6. Are you getting a feeling for your number? It is about being a lone operator, lone wolf or solo traveller (like a bee or a secret agent) who is part of something greater.

John Lennon, born on 9^{th} October 1940 (9 + 1 + 0 + 1 + 9 + 4 + 0) was a Six. He was always the outsider in The Beatles (Nowhere Man) but he was part of the most extraordinary 'hive mind' in musical history.

The Secret Intelligence Service (MI6) collects foreign intelligence. You are a collector, too, just like a bee in the hive. Bletchley Park remains one of the most famous aspects of MI6 and its best-known collector was the genius Alan Turing. A good example of a man alone, who was part of something bigger and impressive.

You will find this role in your personal life (perhaps in groups, clubs, teams, societies, unions, associations, bands) but also in your professional life, where you are a perfectly formed part of the greater whole. Virgo is the sixth sign of the zodiac and she rules the Sixth House of the horoscope. Virgo is very much associated with her part in the greater scheme of things – doing her bit – collecting, gathering and sorting.

Miss Moneypenny in James Bond is a six type! Rather like James, she is a busy bee in the greater hive. James Bond creator Ian Fleming said "Exotic things would happen to and around him, but he would be a neutral figure."

So let's talk about bees. From them, comes royal jelly. You'll have a lifetime of finding yourself as the lone 'gatherer' or hard-working collector of information, or just some kind of nectar. Sweet and precious substances which you help turn into something exotic. Your antennae are amazing. There is nothing so small or densely packed with detail that you cannot detect it or collect it.

Solitary bees can be quite alone, or dive back into their community. Queens and worker bees might make sense to you in terms of your family life, or your professional history. Yet there are also large groups of solitary bees in the six-sided world. You may go between both. Any rich, map-like organization is something that comes easily to you.

In English folk stories, 'telling the bee' meant talking (literally) to a bee about important events in the household. Information gathering again!

Snowflakes are also single ice crystals that form part of a complicated and powerful whole. Clear ice as one, together they make a dazzling white display. The characteristic six branches of a snowflake echoes the fact that you also do well within a branch structure. Snowflakes gather each other up and collect each other, too. Snow itself, based on the number six, reaches far and wide and scoops up whatever it finds, from leaves to insects. As soon as snow itself appears it is also scooped up. Your six birthday number is unique, as are you, like a snowflake – yet part of an amazing whole. What comes out of that is very special.

SEVEN

Seven is a lucky prime number, or happy prime number. That is the mathematical term for it. In Christian-influenced cultures, 7 is fortunate. There are also seven colours of the rainbow. Sir Isaac Newton identified red, yellow, green, blue, violet, orange and indigo. Today we meditate on those colours in the chakra system.

God rested on the seventh day and the seven-day week is the basis on which the modern world turns. There are seven deadly sins and seven virtues: humility, chastity, kindness, patience, abstinence, diligence and liberality.

I'm sure you know about the Seven Wonders of the World, which in ancient times included the Great Pyramid of Giza, the Hanging Gardens of Babylon, the Temple of Artemis, the Statue of Zeus (in modern astrology, Jupiter, the planet of good fortune), the Mausoleum at Halicarnassus, the Colossus of Rhodes (again, Jupiter rules 'colossal' things) and the Lighthouse of Alexandria.

In the modern world the Seven Wonders are the Great Wall of China (great, another Jupiter word), the Taj Mahal in India (enormous), Petra, the statue of Christ the Redeemer, Machu Picchu, the Chichen Iza pyramid and the Colosseum in Rome.

Maybe J.K. Rowling knows something. She wrote a grand total of seven Harry Potter books and released the last one, Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows, in July, the seventh month.

You were born under a number linked with 'more' and abundance. It is very much linked with Jupiter, which in astrology is about what we add to life and what grows. The rainbow was added to by Sir Isaac Newton to give it a greater spectrum of colour. One of the seven virtues is 'liberality' which is tied to this idea. Open arms, welcoming, tolerant, embracing. Perhaps this is where luck comes from. If you are open to life, you tend to hit more targets, more often – by sheer statistical luck.

Are you great and colossal – a larger-than-life figure? Maybe you attract great and colossal things. What starts as 'just one' for a Seven person can grow in amazing ways, in all directions, for a long period. A classic example would be an apartment or house purchase which is extended and expanded over time, perhaps with more rooms outwards and upwards, or a larger garden.

Projects, plans (sometimes families) or initial 'one off' concepts and creations have this tendency to increase and perhaps this is where the lucky reputation of Seven people comes from. There is always more to you than people assume and as a person, you also 'grow' and expand, developing your skills, talents, experience and assets, just as Newton's rainbow grew to have seven colours. You create and make your own pot of gold.

EIGHT

The famous figure-eight shape is well-known in ice skating, but also in sailing - ropes are tied in an 8 coil.

You will also recognise your birthday number as 'sands through the hourglass' or an egg-timer shape. This closed loop is the second magic number in physics. In the Tarot, the symbol for infinity (8 on its side) appears above The Magician and can be seen on selected other cards, created by Pamela Colman Smith and Arthur Waite.

All spiders have eight legs. The octopus has eight arms. Eight is also a film format. Standard 8, Super 8, Video 8, Digital 8 and Hi 8 are also reminiscent of old-fashioned reel-to-reel editing, on machines with two spools of film. An 8-track cartridge is also used to record music.

Pagodas and gazebos have eight sides. The Noble Eightfold Path is well known in Buddhism.

Eight-ball pocket billiards is best known as 'eight ball' and black ball number 8 is the one to pocket but only at the end.

So, there is something quite contradictory about the number 8 and also about you. Let's start at the very beginning. The number itself is two circles on top of each other. They move in opposite directions, if you trace them with a pen.

If you have ever watched skaters on a rink, the same thing occurs. From Dubai to New York, there are always people who stop and spiral! They go against the endless circular loop of the crowd. They begin in one direction and then turn in the other. Figure skating is one of the very few human accomplishments where you are required to go backwards.

This idea of rewinding is also key to the film and music industry which depends so much on that 8 shape which is coded in your birthday. Professional 8 ball players approach the table backwards.

You go backwards to go forwards. You don't live your life the way other people do, because you need to manage your contradictions and differences. It's part of your process, and you can be creative as a result of this.

An octopus with her eight arms swim backwards. I'm sure you've seen the most gifted skaters also going backwards around the rink in competitions. An octopus moves fastest and most efficiently when it jet-propels back!

You are creative, inventive and productive because you don't do things – the way others do. You also have to do it in your own way, which can mean stopping and starting, going back to the beginning, or going backwards. It's not unusual to see 8 birthday people going back to study, for example. As you might expect, people who enjoy art, music, craft, film, television, radio, podcasts and photography, theatre, ballet (all that requires rehearsal, many takes or attempts and a long process) figure prominently in the list of 8 birthdays.

Figure of Eight was a 1989 song by Sir Paul McCartney and Figure Eight is also a song by Status Quo. We also find that 8 shape in English country dance. Even in sailing, where the 8 shape prevails, yachtsmen and yachtswomen set off backwards to go forwards.

You do not have the same relationship with time as other people and have learned to try, try and try again – and trust the process. Life for you is a journey not a destination and all the false starts, mistakes, accidents, long pauses, rewinds and the rest are part of your life path.

You are quite magical, in the sense that The Magician in the Tarot is also magical. You can create all kinds of outcomes by figuring out your moves in a unique way. Forget the instruction book or the correct chronological order. You are intuitive and instinctive.

Any old Alfa Romeo made in Italy has the 8 shape hidden in its emblem, the Savoy Knot. Just like you, any classic Alfa Romeo reverses a lot, but that makes its journeys all the more interesting.

NINE

You can tell a lot about your number, nine, by the quotes it features in. So "A stitch in time saves nine" and "Every cat has nine lives" tells us the same thing. Nine is associated with caution and self-preservation.

Taking care. Being careful not to put a foot wrong. Soft landings and sometimes lucky escapes. Detailed planning and attention to the small things.

You have endurance power and will keep on going, no matter what. You also have a keen sense of self-protection.

Nine months is a pregnancy. This is a classic example of 'nine' association, as the moment a pregnancy is confirmed, it's all about protection, preservation, slow and careful safe landing skills and powerful survival instincts.

You don't leave anything to chance and prefer a guidebook, instructions, a map, compass and light house. If you have ever watched a cat (the animal with which your number is associated) walk across a fence line, you'll see classic number 9 traits.

Slow and steady, watchful and wise. In your personal life or professional life you approach everything one step at a time, best foot forward, tiptoeing and never rushing in. This idea of 'edging' towards what you want and getting there in the end, is what your birthday number suggests about your relationships but also the work you do.

If you look at the number 9 written down, you can almost see a pregnant woman's stomach with its nine-month bulge and her arm protecting it. You nurture yourself and who or what is so important to you, by making sure nothing is left to chance and you avoid the known risks.

I am sure you know that 999 is an emergency number, from the United Kingdom to Hong Kong. On British beaches it is used to call the coastguard. Police, ambulance and fire services also answer to the 999 call. Did you know 999 is also used to call mountain rescue, cave rescue, mine rescue and even bomb disposal? In the dark, or in smoke, the number 999 could be easily found on a old-fashioned round-dial telephone, as 9 was the last hole on the dial and ringing for help was a matter of repeating the number three times. It was also short!

You are very good at risk management, if you are true to your 9 birthday number. You can also take care of yourself, through life's challenges and you always land on your feet, just like a cat with nine lives. You are also skilled at 'Keep Calm and Carry On' with those you need to protect and look after – like your own children, perhaps, or just about any person or animal which is vulnerable. You are experienced enough to know that life can offer all kinds of scenarios, even from childhood or your teenage years, and so your path is one of awareness, practicality and above all else – knowing what it means to safeguard security.
